Adult Faith Formation at St. Thomas More

“Catechesis for adults, since it deals with persons who are capable of an adherence which is fully responsible, must be considered the chief form of catechesis. All other forms, which are indeed always necessary, are in some way oriented to it.”

In the past year the Faith Formation Task Force appointed by Fr. Scott has recommended that the parish expand opportunities for lifelong faith formation, evangelization and spiritual growth in our community, including the following objectives:

1. Expand adult and family faith formation programs by offering retreats, small group ministries, spiritual direction and other opportunities.
2. Create accessible opportunities for faith formation, liturgical and spiritual growth for all members of our Community. (Considerations may include location, transportation, affordability, time frame, language and childcare.)
3. Support and promote marriage and family life enrichment opportunities.
4. Enable parishioners to strengthen their faith and renew their baptismal call in order that we may reach out to those have never heard the Good News of the Gospel.

With these objectives in mind, the parish now offers the programs listed overleaf, to begin to form parishioners in their mission as Catholic disciples and witnesses to their faith.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops writes,

“Adult faith formation, by which people consciously grow in the life of Christ through experience, reflection, prayer, and study, must be “the central task in the catechetical enterprise,” becoming “the axis around which revolves the catechesis of childhood and adolescence as well as that of old age.” (Our Hearts Are Burning Within Us, n.5)

With this in mind, you are invited to grow in faithfulness to the Lord Jesus and his Church, which has the mandate to continue his mission of proclaiming the coming of the Kingdom of God.
